EARLE LECTURES IN NEW TESTAMENT – DR. JOEL GREEN THEOLOGICAL INTERPRETATION OF SCRIPTURE MARCH 16 - 18, 2010

DR. JOEL B. GREEN has been Associate Dean for the Center for Advanced Theological Studies since 2008 and professor of New Testament Interpretation since 2007 at Fuller Theological Seminary; prior to that, he served for ten years at Asbury Theological Seminary as Professor of New Testament Interpretation, as Dean of the School of Theology, and as Provost. Green has written or edited 30 books, including four that have won awards. Green has 12 years of pastoral ministry and more than 20 years of seminary teaching experience in multiple countries.
