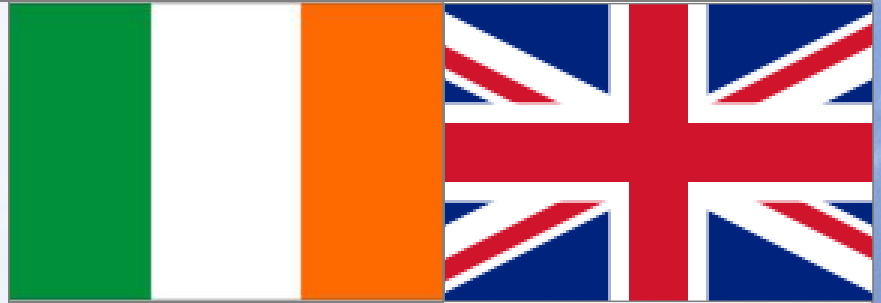

Ireland/Northern Ireland

The Green Isle has a unique opportunity for students to learn from and minister in a culture rich with religious history. Ireland and Northern Ireland, alike, have a strong rooted history in Catholic and Protestant tradition starting from the period of the Viking through the arrival of Saint Patrick and the years of Civil War, which nearly tore the island apart.

Within the context of graduate theological studies, students will have the opportunity to work along side ministries in evangelism, church development, youth and children ministries, outreach ministries and discipleship training. Along with these opportunities students will experience the cultural life from historic monasteries in Glendalough (pronounced Glen-da-lock), to the diverse culture of Dublin city center, to the coastal towns throughout the Eastern portion of the island.

For students interested in more developmental church ministries, the Republic of Ireland is perfect for those adventurous spirits. No two ministries look the same and each day is an opportunity for relationship building in a highly relational country. Join the locals at the pub for a meal or for local trad (traditional Irish songs) music or listen to the bag pipers walking the beaches each sunset.

Both sites in Ireland and Northern Ireland provide students with an opportunity to serve God intentionally for a year while being shaped for continued cross-cultural ministry through graduate theological studies with NTS!

365 Days in Mission (365m) is a Diploma in Cross-Cultural Ministry from Nazarene Theological Seminary in which students may earn up to 24 hours of graduate school credit while learning from NTS faculty and mentors in a global context.
