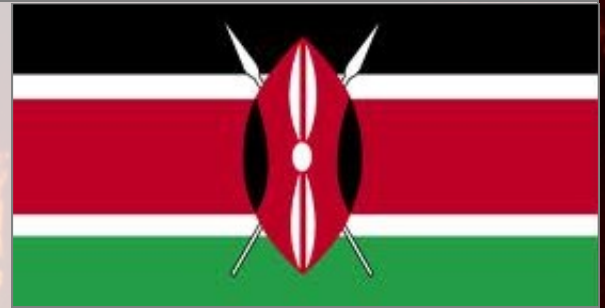

Kenya (Africa Nazarene University)

The Church of the Nazarene's commitment to providing higher education and its deep awareness of the great need for University education in Africa, facilitated the establishment of Africa Nazarene University, which opened its doors to the pioneer group of students in August 1994 at its main campus in Ongata Rongai on the outskirts of Nairobi. ANU received its Charter, representing full accreditation, from the Commission for Higher Education in Kenya in October 2002.

The vision of Africa Nazarene University is to be:

- a light to the people of Africa through higher education grounded in the Wesleyan-Holiness tradition;
- the University of choice for Christians desiring academic excellence;
- a community which will produce individuals of character and integrity of heart; and
- a place where lives will be transformed for service and leadership to make a difference in Africa and the World.

The mission of Africa Nazarene University is to provide holistic education that develops individuals academically, spiritually, culturally and physically, and to equip them with excellent skills, competencies and Christian values which will enable them to go into the world well prepared to meet the challenges of their time. The University's desire to extend its reach, required the development of additional campuses and centers plus the formation of an Institute of Open and Distance Learning which assist the University in providing services to people in need of higher education outside Nairobi and our traditional educational programs. ANU will provide 365m participants who feel a particular call to minister through higher education, the opportunity to explore the impact of culture within the classroom and on the worldview of multicultural students.

365 Days in Mission (365m) is a Diploma in Cross-Cultural Ministry from Nazarene Theological Seminary in which students may earn up to 24 hours of graduate school credit while learning from NTS faculty and mentors in a global context.
