



Full-Time Faculty (open rank)

Nazarene Theological Seminary is seeking applicants for a full-time, open-rank, professor of either Old Testament or the History of Christianity to begin Fall 2019. A separate search for the remaining position/discipline—Old Testament or Church History—is anticipated for Fall 2020.

Responsibilities will include teaching graduate introductory and specialized courses, advising Doctor of Ministry students, and participation in the spiritual formation of students. NTS faculty teach in online/hybrid and traditional formats. Candidates should demonstrate familiarity with changing ministerial contexts and innovative approaches to teaching and Christian practice.

The ideal candidate will hold a terminal degree, preferably a Ph.D. or Th.D., and have a record of excellence in teaching, scholarship, and ecclesial practice. Candidates for Old Testament should be able to teach Hebrew language courses and biblical theology courses in addition to an area of specialization. For candidates in the History of Christianity, preference will be given to persons with expertise in the areas of British and American Methodism, Holiness movements, and the history of evangelicalism.

Nazarene Theological Seminary is a graduate school of theology in the Wesleyan-Holiness tradition that prepares women and men—academically, professionally, and spiritually—for ministry in various contexts. As part of its mission, NTS seeks to be a theological resource to the Church of the Nazarene and the broader Christian Church. NTS offers four master's degrees, a Doctor of Ministry degree, and various courses and events through its Center for Pastoral Leadership.
