*VC (Video Conferencing Classroom): Enrollment in a video conferencing class shall require that a student be located a minimum of one hundred miles from campus and secure the permission of the course professor to enroll in the course. The student must:

1. Download and successfully install the NTS video conferencing software
2. Be connected to a High-speed Internet connection with a minimum of 1MB **upload & download** speed
3. Possess a computer with a tested webcam
4. Use a headset with attached microphone
5. Complete a test connection prior to the first day of class from the location in which they will connect to class (i.e. home network, church network, etc.)
