



Full-Time Professor of World Christianity (open rank)

Nazarene Theological Seminary is seeking applicants for a full-time, open-rank, professor of World Christianity. Position is open until filled with a start date as early as August 2020.

Candidates must hold (or be near completion of) a terminal degree, preferably a Ph.D. or Th.D., and have a record of excellence in teaching, scholarship, and ecclesial practice. Ideal candidates will have a corresponding specialization in the History of Christianity or Theology from which to engage one or more aspects of World Christianity (global theologies, history of Christian movements, etc.). Familiarity with or expertise in global developments of Methodism, Holiness movements, and/or evangelicalism will be advantageous.

Responsibilities will include teaching graduate introductory and specialized courses, advising Doctor of Ministry students, and participation in the spiritual formation of students. NTS faculty teach in online/hybrid and traditional formats and have standard teaching loads of 6 courses per year. Candidates should demonstrate familiarity with changing ministerial contexts and innovative approaches to teaching and Christian practice.

Nazarene Theological Seminary is a graduate school of theology in the Wesleyan-Holiness tradition that prepares women and men—academically, professionally, and spiritually—for ministry in various contexts. As part of its mission, NTS seeks to be a theological resource to the Church of the Nazarene (a global denomination with approx. 75% of its membership outside North America) and the broader Christian Church. NTS offers four master's degrees, a Doctor of Ministry degree, and various courses and events through its Center for Pastoral Leadership.
